Leadership

We're going to make sure that St Anne's middle and senior leaders are developing their own skills in improving the quality of teaching and learning, so that all the pupils at St Anne's make the most progress they can each year.



Attendance

Our attendance was 96.5% last year. This is above the National Average. We are now working hard on punctuality so that no minutes are lost in education.

Sports

We are using our Sports' Premium funding to offer a broader range of activities to pupils. We are also developing a Sensory Circuits Club at 8:35am to enable children to reach the level of alertness needed to concentrate during lessons.



Pupil Outcomes

We want to make sure that more pupils in each class are achieving greater depth in all aspects of their learning.



Reading and Writing

We want to ensure that reading and writing standards are reflected in other aspects of the curriculum and further develop reading skills through the use of Lexia and the Reading For All programme. We also want to develop the opportunities for reading and writing enrichment opportunities.

Pupil Outcomes

Our Early Years and KS1 teams will be working hard to make sure that even more children achieve the expected level in English and Maths at the end of EYFS and phonics at the end of Year 1.

Governance

Our school governors will continue to make sure that everyone is striving to be 'the best that they can be' at St Anne's through regular visits and checks. They'll meet regularly through the year to check how well we are doing and to support us.



Welfare

We want to make sure that as many of our families as possible are supported and helped when they need it. Our CARITAS worker will be finding new ways to do this with you.



White Rose Maths

We are now using new materials from The White Rose Maths Hub to support the teaching, resourcing and assessing of Maths. This will support us in further developing the children's fluency, reasoning and problem solving.



Achievement for All

Our staff are receiving training in order for them to help parents in identifying any barriers to learning which can then be supported at home.
